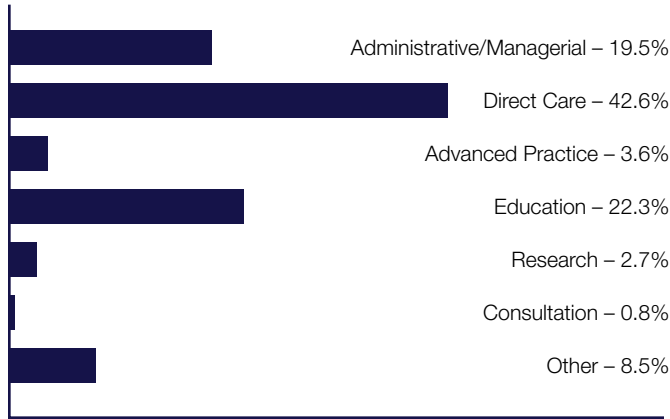

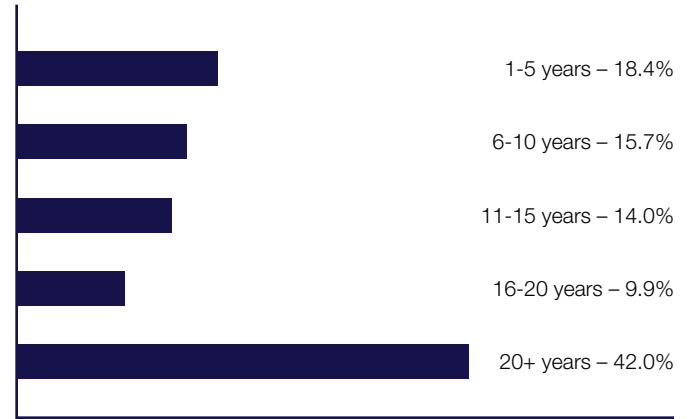
Who Will You Meet at SPN's Annual Conference?
